HISTORIAN'S CORNER BY: PRESLEY RUSH



The History of 4-H in New Mexico

4-H in New Mexico started in January of 1912 when the NMAC (New Mexico Agricultural College) and the Santa Fe Railroad ran an agricultural train through all parts of New Mexico. They had livestock and Farm exhibits; they gave educational talks by specialists from the agricultural college. They also held special meetings with young boys and girls in which club work was discussed. In 1913, the same general plan was followed by cooperation in the El Paso and Southwest Railway; as a result, several boys' and girls' clubs were organized. The Smith-Lever Act in 1914 and the permanent establishment of the Cooperative Extension in New Mexico concentrated more on club work.

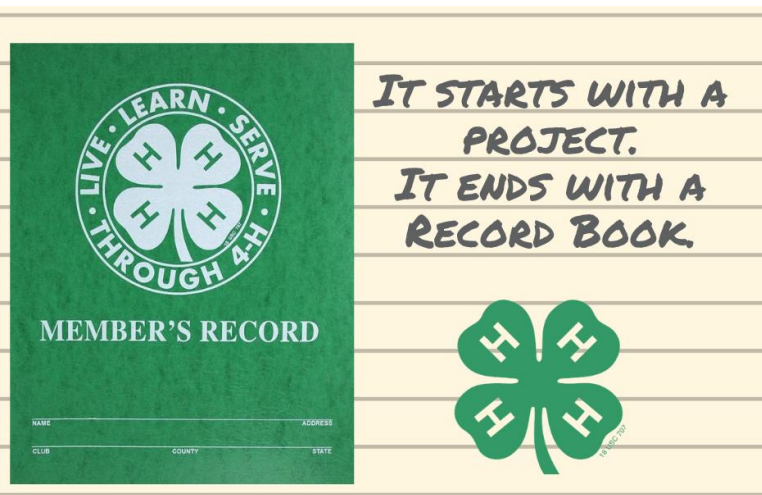

4-H ENROLLMENT

- Enrollment is open from October 1- March 1.
- Previous/Current Members Enrollment Deadline – January 15
 - Have been a member of 4-H in 2023-2024 or prior
- ***New Membership Enrollment Deadline– March 1st***
 - ***Have never been enrolled in 4-H and are brand new members***
- The deadline to add projects is July 1.

4-H AGES for the 2024-2025 4-H Year

Age as of January 1, 2024 - the current 4-H Year (October- October)	5, 6, 7 – 8 year olds in the 2nd grade	8 year olds in the 3rd grade, 9 year olds, 10 year olds, 11 year olds in the 5th grade	11 year olds in the 6th grade; 12 year olds; 13 year olds in the 7th grade	13 year olds in the 8th grade; 14 year olds; 15 year olds; 16 year olds; 17 year olds; 18 year olds; Youth who are 19 by December 31 of the current 4-H year are not eligible to enroll as a 4-H member.

*Grade as of January 1 of the current 4-H year (October-September).

Accordingly, youth participate in summer and fall fair activities in the grade they just completed. These are standard grades based on public school general ages. Exceptions such as home or private schools or youth who have skipped a grade must be determined under the appropriate age.

Active Membership

Curry County 4-H members must maintain an “Active Membership” status prior to participation in 4-H Rodeo, County Contests, District and State Conference, or Junior Divisions of the Curry County Fair. An “active” member will be considered one who completes enrollment prior to January 15th or March 1, attends four (4) or more regularly scheduled 4-H meetings. No more than two (2) meetings in any given month will count toward the membership requirement. Meetings count during the 4-H year which is October 1st through September 30th.
