- Enrollment is open from October 1- March 1.
- Previous/Current Members Enrollment Deadline – January 15
  - Have been a member of 4-H in 2023-2024 or prior
- ***New Membership Enrollment Deadline– March 1<sup>st</sup>***
  - ***Have never been enrolled in 4-H and are brand new members***
- The deadline to add projects is July 1.

Age as of January 1, 2024 - the current 4-H Year (October-October)	5, 6, 7 – 8 year olds in the 2nd grade	8 year olds in the 3rd grade, 9 year olds, 10 year olds, 11 year olds in the 5th grade	11 year olds in the 6th grade; 12 year olds; 13 year olds in the 7th grade	13 year olds in the 8th grade; 14 year olds; 15 year olds; 16 year olds; 17 year olds; 18 year olds; Youth who are 19 by December 31 of the current 4-H year are not eligible to enroll as a 4-H member.

\*Grade as of January 1 of the current 4-H year (October-September).

Accordingly, youth participate in summer and fall fair activities in the grade they just completed. These are standard grades based on public school general ages. Exceptions such as home or private schools or youth who have skipped a grade must be determined under the appropriate age.

## **Active Membership**

Curry County 4-H members must maintain an “Active Membership” status prior to participation in 4-H Rodeo, County Contests, District and State Conference, or Junior Divisions of the Curry County Fair. An “active” member will be considered one who completes enrollment prior to January 15<sup>th</sup> or March 1, attends four (4) or more regularly scheduled 4-H meetings. No more than two (2) meetings in any given month will count toward the membership requirement. Meetings count during the 4-H year which is October 1<sup>st</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup>.

# 2024-2025 Enrollment

If you were a member of Curry County 4-H last year, you have a ZSuites account. It is under the primary email you used to enroll. Each family is created under a Household, so you can update all youth and volunteers in one account. Projects may be added or dropped until July 1.

**The deadline for currently enrolled members has passed, new members deadline is March 1.** Families that are interested in enrolling, please contact the Curry County Extension Office for information, guidelines and requirements.

**REMINDER:** All members are **REQUIRED** to attend a minimum number of 4 club meetings to participate in county and state 4-H activities, this includes entering or showing projects at the county fair. Reach out to your club leader if you have questions. To attend SLR, FCS School and YGA; members must have attended 3 club meetings.

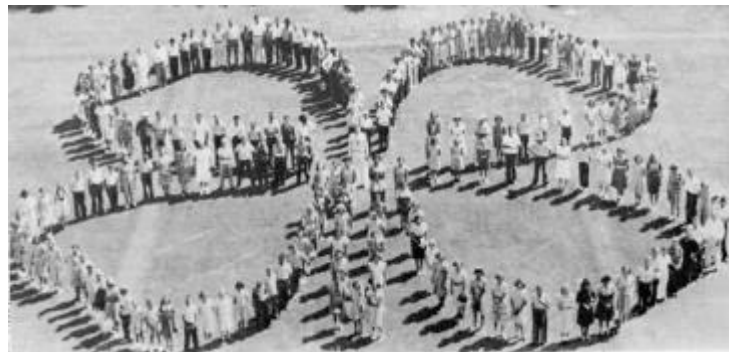

## HISTORIAN'S CORNER – BY PRESLEY RUSH THE HISTORY OF THE 4-H CLOVER

The 4-H emblem is a green four-leaf clover with a white H on each of its petals representing head, heart, hand, and health. A little fact about the 4-H clover is the stem is always to the right. In 1907 to 1908 the clover was designed by O.H. Benson, Superintendent of the Wright County Schools in Iowa. It is said that one sunny June morning in 1906 in a one room school near Clarion, Iowa there were 11 students spending their recess picking clovers when a visitor drove up. The teachers suggested that they surrender their clovers to the Superintendent. The students did as they were told, and the Superintendent told them that he had been looking for an emblem for the agriculture clubs for the schools in their county and he chose the clover. Superintendent Benson also said that the four-leaf clover will help explain the message of the four-square education, which is what 4-H was originally known as.
